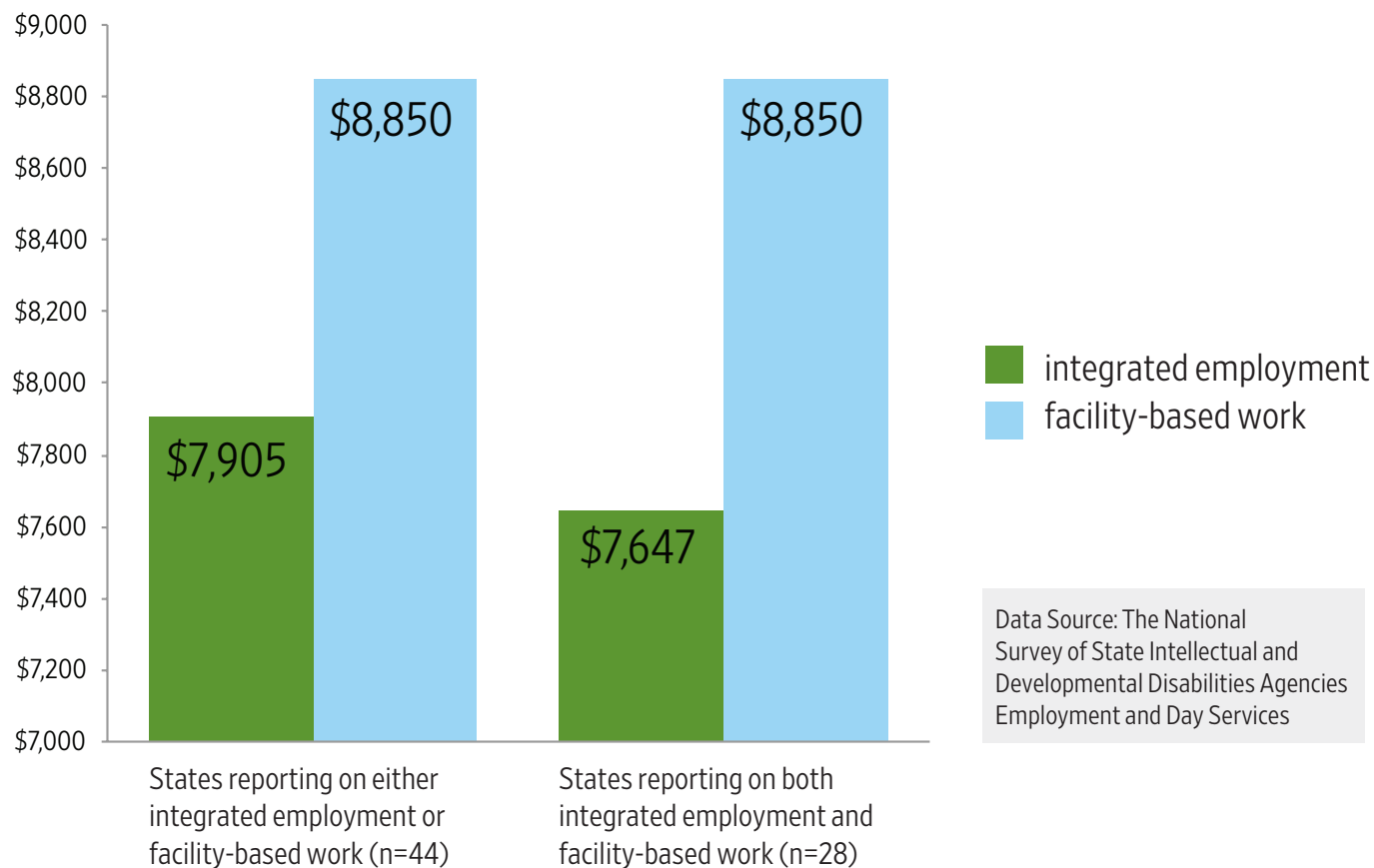


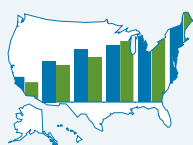
## Findings from State Intellectual and/or Developmental Disability agency administrators suggest that states continue to spend more on average per person in facility-based work rather than integrated employment.
